From the words of Rudy “nearly all these men don’t have a lick of athletic ability”, however, despite this, they have subjected their bodies to two a day practices, full pads/helmets and grueling workouts. It would be enough for them to say they finished the week alive and celebrate accomplishments, but these 41 men decided this week was not just about themselves. They decided to reach out to the community and “give back.”

They have started “Fantasy Football Cares”, a fund raising effort to assist non-profits in the South Bend Community. Big Brothers Big Sisters of St. Joseph County has been chosen as the recipient of this year’s donations.

The festivities begin with a tailgate luncheon in the stadium parking lot on June 7th beginning at 11:30 a.m. for the Big Brother and Sister mentors and their Little Brothers and Sisters. At approximately 12:30 p.m. they will be escorted into the stadium prior to the game for pictures with the team and coaching staff.

The game begins at approximately 1:00 p.m. and is free and open to the public.
